


Following the glory of Easter we consider the birth and life of the Church

Smyrna • An important city of size on Agean coast • Large natural harbour • Today is the city of Izmir in Turkey – 3,000,000 people





i. Angel of Smyrna (v8) Description of Christ refers back to theophany – 'the First and Last'; 'who was dead and came to life' (Revelation 1:17-18) • A focus on the living Christ • "And see, I am alive forever and ever" (1:18)

i. İ Know (v9) i. Affliction – severe trials & serious challenges ii. Excessive/extreme poverty although called 'spiritually rich' ~ a contrast to the church of Laodicea – economically rich but spiritually poor (3:15-17)

iii. İ Know (v9) iii. Suffering slander/hardship from opposing forces in Smyrna • Imperial Court – Emperor cult • Jewish community resistance – martyrdom of Polycarp (Bishop of Smyrna)

İ. İ Know (v9) God knows all about our suffering. He is a compassionate Father who is with us in every situation. He understands and walks with us.







To the Persecuted Church Churches under attack; Syria, Iraq, North Korea For us in the west persecution is also real – but psychical – attacks on our mind, spirit; attacks of anxiety, distraction, depression

IV. Promise (v10b-11)

"Let anyone who has an ear listen..."

- The quality of our listening
- Churches are listening posts
- We are not to have 'heavy ears' (Isaiah 6:10) but 'ears that are awake' (Isaiah 50:4)

The promise - we will not experience death but life.

- · Given 'the crown of life'
- Not be harmed by 'the second death'
- No separation from God
 only life with God

A Call to Follow Jesus

- 'take up your cross and follow me'
- Suffering is part of the human condition
