hate your enemy' ... but I say


to you..." (v43-44)

- Love your neighbour' (Leviticus 19:18) but 'hate your enemy' is a scribal interpretation
 Indicative of dualistic thinking a simplistic one or the other viewpoint
- > The heart of love is the centre of the gospel

UNDIFFERENTIATING LOVE

- 1. Philia friendship Love
- 2. Eros sexual love
- 3. Storge familial love
- 4. Agape giving for the good of the other – a word practically unknown before Christ

AGAPE LOVE


- > It is towards agape love that Jesus invites us to journey
- We may not like someone but still demonstrate agape love how we treat the other

■ Negative Actions Positive Responses

- , 'Agape' your enemies the command of Jesus
- Those persecuting you you seek the best for them
- > Demonstrate 'agape' by praying for your enemies

No, 'if your enemies are hungry, feed them; if they are thirsty, give them something to drink; for by doing this you will heap burning coals on their heads.' Do not be overcome by evil, but overcome evil with good.

Romans 12:20-21




so that you may be children of your Father in heaven; for he makes his sun rise on the evil and on the good, and sends rain on the righteous and on the unrighteous.

THE NATURE OF GOD > Loves all > Desires the best for all > Makes His sun shine on all - rain for all

WE ARE CHILDREN OF GOD He is our Father in heaven "Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God" (5:9) We are called to share in God's peacemaking



THE WORLD'S APPROACH

- > Be nice to your friends and treat harshly your enemies seen in political rhetoric
- > Even tax collectors (v47) and gentiles (v48) are nice to their friends

OUR HIGH CALLING

> We are invited to supersede the world's philosophy – the Good Samaritan demonstrates our love for neighbour (Luke 10)

- God is our great lover and we are to imitate him (Ephesians 5:1-2)
- We are not to be selective in our love



- , "Be perfect (teleios) as your Heavenly Tather is perfect." (v48)
- , be complete, integrated
- , Wholeness
- Mature

JESUS AND THE YOUNG RICH RULER

- , 'If you wish to be perfect'
- > 'Come and follow me' (Matthew 19:21)

AN IMPERATIVE TO IMITATE GOD

- > Based on an Old Testament saying - 'You shall be holy as the Lord your God is holy'
- A call to be compassionate, merciful as God is



'NO MATTER WHAT' LOVE

- > Being compassionate/perfect as God is compassionate reflects the greater righteousness that Jesus espouses (Matthew 5:20)
- > Not reducing humanity to friends' + 'enemies'

A NEW SOCIETY

As God's church we are to be at the vanguard of God's new society - a society of Love and compassion

- > Not to dismiss Jesus' invitation to love as an unreasonable request
- > Sit with it consider how we can love our enemies

DECISION TO CHANGE

- It's not a once for all decision but a recalibration and reassessment of old and tired ways
- Keep coming back to a place of love for the other person
