- » This majestic God seeks to be in relationship with us
- » It is not about information
- » It's about a God who knows our name

Psalms

To Know Ourselves Psalm 90:3-12

You turn us back to dust, and say, 'Turn back, you mortals.' For a thousand years in your sight are like yesterday when it is past, or like a watch in the night.

You sweep them away; they are like a dream, like grass that is renewed in the morning; in the morning it flourishes and is renewed; in the evening it fades and withers.

Psalm 90:3-6

Know Our Limitation/ Finiteness

- » Dust (v3)
- » Grass (v5-6)
- » We are like grass
- » God is infinite

Know Our Sinfulness

- » The reality of our disorientation (v7-8)
- » To live in awareness of our frailty

Have a Wise heart

- » Verse 12 is the key
- » To understand the convergence of our calling
- » Often we do the very opposite – ‘deny death’

Psalms

To Live Passionately Before God

Satisfy us in the morning with your steadfast love, so that we may rejoice and be glad all our days.

Psalm 90:14

Let the favour of the Lord our God be upon us, and prosper for us the work of our hands— O prosper the work of our hands!

Psalm 90:17

Not ‘Hunkering Down’

- » Not to be discouraged
- » Not to live passively

Live Enthusiastically

- » 'Satisfy us' (v14)
- » 'make us glad' (v15)
- » 'let us see your work' (v16)
- » 'let your favour rest on us' (v17)

Not Resignation

- » Rather a dynamic prayer
'fill my cup Lord!'

'Prosper'

- » 2x - 'prosper the work of our hands'
- » A call for the infinite God to break into our lives (v17)
- » Establish our work

Live in Confidence

- » This is a call to live in hope/confidence before God
- » A God who is in relationship with us
- » Our work is significant both individually and corporately
