





## FRUIT OF THE SPERIT

By contrast, the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. There is no law against such things.

### one Fruit, Eight Dimensions

- One fruit: Love
- "Love is patient; love is kind; love is not envious or boastful or arrogant or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful;" (1 Corinthians 13:4-5)
- "Above all, clothe yourselves with love, which binds everything together in perfect harmony." (Colossians 3:14)





And those who belong to Christ Jesus have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires. If we live by the Spirit, let us also be guided by the Spirit. Let us not become conceited, competing against one another, envying one another.

- Competing with one another, envying one another
- 8 of the 15 items of the flesh (v19-21) have to do with conflict in the community
