

### Amos 8:1-3

- A vision Amos sees of God's judgement upon Israel
- The 4<sup>th</sup> of 4 visions starting in Amos 7
- A play on words ending with Israel's 'end has come' (v2) and 'summer fruit' (v1)

Hear this, you that trample on the needy, and bring to ruin the poor of the land, saying, 'When will the new moon be over so that we may sell grain; and the sabbath, so that we may offer wheat for sale?

We will make the ephah small and the shekel great, and practise deceit with false balances, buying the poor for silver and the needy for a pair of sandals, and selling the sweepings of the wheat.'

Amos 8:4-6



### Lacking Justice & Care

- Booming times/business leaders anxious to do business
- Trample the poor (v4)
- Ignore the Sabbath (v5)
- Actions of exploitation (v6)

# Insatiable Greed

- Waiting for the new moon & Sabbath to end (v5a)
- Not honouring the spirit of the Sabbath

### **Cheating Customers**

- Use of false weights & shekels (v5b)
- Rigged scales

### **Extreme Exploitation**

- Poor Sold as Slaves (v6)
- Dishonest measurements on scales – see Leviticus 19:35-37; Micah 6:9-11

### God's Concern

- Not just concern for worship
- Concern also for ethics through the week social justice
- Sanctuary & shop

### Result

- God's judgement upon Israel (v7-8)
- The sound of an earthquake (v8)



# 1. God's Concern

- God cares for the poor and oppressed
- The prophet brings attention to the poor and powerless

## 2. Religion & The Everyday

- Faith & 'business' are linked
- There is to be no convenient dichotomy between the two spheres

This prophetic word rejects that dichotomy between faith and life. Religion, it says, has to do with the whole of life, holy day and holy place, but also every day and every place.

#### 4. Greed

- One of the Seven Deadly sins
- Speaks to our attitudes towards possessions & wealth – a desire for avarice or profit overrides a concern for the powerless
- Stealing (Exodus 20:15)

# 5. 'Famine for God's Word'

- Part of the nation's judgment
- They will seek to hear the word but they will not find it

He humbled you by letting you hunger, then by feeding you with manna, with which neither you nor your ancestors were acquainted, in order to make you understand that one does not live by bread alone, but by every word that comes from the mouth of the LORD.

### Not By Bread Alone
